

Pastor Doug's Musings
July 2021

"But God has helped me to this very day; so I stand here and testify to small and great alike." Acts 26:22a

I ran across a story that captured not only my attention, but also my heart. There was a young man who was parked in front of a mall polishing his car while waiting for his wife to complete her shopping. As he buffed his car coming from across the parking lot was what appeared to be a street person. From the looks of him, he had no car, no home, no clean clothes, and no money.



There are times when we feel generous but there are other times that you just don't want to be bothered. This was one of those "I don't want to be bothered times." The young man put more effort and focus on his polishing efforts. He didn't want to even look up because he was sure that guy was going to ask for money.

The street man sat on the curb in front of a bus stop, just short distance from the young man. The young man thought to himself, "if this guy has enough money for bus fare, I'd be surprised." After a few minutes our street friend spoke. "That's a very sharp car," he said.

He was ragged but had an air of dignity about him. The young man replied, "Thanks," and continued buffing his car. The man sat quietly and watched the young man buff away. The expected plea for money never came.

As the silence between them widened a tiny voice inside urged the young man, "Ask him if he needs any help." The young man was sure he would say "Yes," but that inner voice persisted "ask him ask him 'Do you need any help?'"

He answered in three simple but profound words that the young man shall never forget. Three words that shook the young man to the core: "Don't we all?" he said.

The young man had a certain air of superiority about him and was feeling self-important and superior to, and certainly more successful and more well off than

the lowly street man who sat at the curb . . . that is until those three words hit him like a punch to the gut. “Don’t we all?”

The young man instantly heard the inner voice again “I need help” Maybe not for bus fare or a place to sleep, but “I needed help.” The young man reached in his wallet and gave his new friend not only enough for bus fare, but enough to get a warm meal and shelter for the day.

Those three little words still ring true. No matter how much you have, no matter what you have accomplished . . . you and I need help too. None of us can go it alone forever. None of us have unlimited resources. None of us have all the answers.

When we go through the storms of life. . . . When we endure a season of covid When the rug is pulled out from under us for the umpteenth timewhen we are drained to our last all of a sudden, we realize we need help. Asking for help is a humbling experience. Asking for help is an honest admission that sometimes life is overwhelming. When I read the Psalms, I continue to be amazed at how many of the Psalms are a cry for help from God. The enemies are just too great. “Help me, Lord.” Old Paul went through about as many terrible things as anyone that has ever lived. He knew he had God’s help to see him through. He trusted God’s help would be there when he needed it. And it always was. God’s help is available for us as well.

Two prayer petitions I pray almost every day is “Help me, Lord.” And that is followed by a litany of things that I know I can’t tackle alone. And my second petition is “Help them,” which is followed by a list of friends and family that I know who are up against it. I know my/our prayers of intercession make a difference for those around me that I love and care about.

Maybe the man was just a homeless stranger wandering the streets. But then again, maybe he was more than that. Maybe God looked down, pressed an angel into service, dressed him like a bum and then said, “Go minister to the young man buffing his car. That man needs help. Don’t we all?”

CHURCH COUNCIL




- ✚ Pastor Doug led us in **devotion and prayer** around “**Joining Jesus on His Mission**” and highlighted that St. James has been doing this in the last 12 months. Examples came up as the Call Committee updated the St. James Call Profile and the most recent example was the funeral and luncheon given for long time member Reah Lininger.
- ✚ **Pastor Doug** summarized everything he had been engaged with at St. James in the past month and highlighted Luke Stearns’ baptism, the start of planning for VBS in July, his engagement with the NALC Great Commission vetting work and the Heartland Mission District Mission Team. He also announced that he had submitted a letter to Bethel indicating that he planned to retire from ministry at Bethel as of July 31, 2021.
- ✚ Dawn Hahm reported that the **Call Committee** had met and updated the Call Profile - especially the “current state” of the congregation based on the last 10 months. The revised Call Profile has been posted to the NALC site. Pastor Doug indicated that we are waiting for the NALC to publish more information on “Ordination in Special Circumstances” to see if that will offer any additional options.
- ✚ Linda Hess reported on the **Care & Prayer Ministry** Committee and indicated that the communion kits and process is being used. The Committee also reviewed the Council retreat ideas and liked them and will work on them going forward. The ministry list was reviewed and updated with actions needed.
- ✚ Alison LaFlower reported that the **Christian Education Committee’s** focus is now on VBS scheduled for July 25 – 27 and plans for confirmation, Father’s Day and Children’s Sunday School restart in mid-late August. Children’s Sunday School will have two classes K – 2nd and 3rd – 6th grades. A second teacher (or more) is needed. Adult Sunday School and two Christ Care groups are meeting twice a month. A new Member Class will be scheduled soon also.
- ✚ Jeff Stearns reported on the **Church Property** activities which have mostly centered around planning to get the parsonage ready for renters. The Shull’s have indicated that they will not be staying.
- ✚ Cindy Gregory presented and reviewed the current **financial status** of the congregation.
 - Cindy mentioned that Flower Fund balance is in the negative over \$700 already and is not included in the church’s budget - it is funded by special giving contributions from church members. The Worship Committee is considering options.
 - Terry reported that Bethesda was not purchased, and we have not received any notice that they moving out.

- The **Finance Committee** reviewed a proposal from the Copier/Printer Team to replace the current copier with a new and less expensive option. They agreed on a purchase option and took it to the Council for consideration. The Council approved the proposal.
- ✚ Terry Clark reported that the **Mission, Benevolence and Outreach (MBO) Committee** is vetting the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC) that we currently support through Benevolence, the Lutheran Military Veterans & Family Ministry (LMVFM) as a new Mission to support and would replace the CRU support for Mathilda Bell (which is ending) as well as starting to discuss supporting the North American Lutheran Church's Seminary (NALS) under Benevolence. In addition, authorization was given to support VBS advertising under Outreach.
- ✚ Joe Soberalski reported that the **Technology Committee** had completed the priorities for the action items on the committee's list and then reviewed the Council Retreat ideas and they coincided with the action items and priorities already on the committee's list. The Committee is actively pursuing the top seventeen items on the list.
- ✚ Marieta Fargo-Boone reported that the **Worship & Music Committee** will continue to ask the congregation through bulletins and the newsletter for contributions to the flower fund and discussed alternatives including using artificial flowers and not having flowers unless they are sponsored. They are reviewing Council Retreat ideas and will get back to Council with their assessment. Marieta also brought up the importance of the liturgy in worship and will be discussing this with some members who have brought this to her attention.
- ✚ Dawn Hahm and Pastor Doug reviewed the **current membership roster update** including a request to transfer membership.
- ✚ The Council Liaisons to the Committees were reminded that the Committees need to determine **next steps for the Council Retreat ideas** with those needing funding considerations ready for the August Finance meeting.
- ✚ The Council discussed nominations for a delegate from St. James to attend the 2021 Lutheran Week in Corpus Christi, Texas August 2 – 6, 2021. John Browder was nominated (and accepted the nomination a few days after the meeting). John is the Council Liaison and Chair of the Stewardship Committee and will be able to attend a special workshop at the event about a new and different stewardship approach. Pastor Doug and John will represent St. James and vote on any items on the agenda requiring decisions.


CHOIR

We play capture the flag at the lake do some even more fun games when the counselors turn into animals and the campers have to take the animals back to the zoo by bribing them with their favorite foods.



I have led chapel service a couple of times and the kids loved it. I also do daily bible studies with my cabin and nightly devotionals with them.


We also do this thing called outpost where we get our sleeping bags and sleep underneath the stars, eat s'mores, and roast hotdogs over the fire which is very fun.
