

THE FIRST LESSON – Deuteronomy 4:1-2, 6-9

New International Version

4 Now, Israel, hear the decrees and laws I am about to teach you. Follow them so that you may live and may go in and take possession of the land the LORD, the God of your ancestors, is giving you. ² Do not add to what I command you and do not subtract from it, but keep the commands of the LORD your God that I give you.

⁶ Observe them carefully, for this will show your wisdom and understanding to the nations, who will hear about all these decrees and say, “Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people.” ⁷ What other nation is so great as to have their gods near them the way the LORD our God is near us whenever we pray to him? ⁸ And what other nation is so great as to have

With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people. ¹⁹ Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, ²⁰ for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should.



BLESSING OF OUR BIBLES

P: The Reformation had a lot of issues that people like Martin Luther thought were wrong with the church. None was more important than the place and the authority of the Word of God. For Luther and for us, the Word of God provides to us the source and the content of our faith. The commands and promises we find in Scripture bear witness to the salvation he has brought to us in Christ Jesus. In God's Word we encounter the ultimate Truth – about ourselves, our world, and God.

Scripture is not simply a collection of human thoughts about God; it is an expression of God's thoughts and intentions for us. In the book of Timothy it says . . . Scripture is "useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness." Like a tool or instrument, God himself uses the Scripture to do his work in us. So let's share in this litany as we dedicate these Bibles to the glory of God.

P: Martin Luther wanted to get God's Word into the hands of the people. He made sure that Word was in the language of the people.

C: We give thanks we have these Bibles. It is a true gift and blessing we can never take for granted.

P: Throughout the ages, the Scriptures have done a number things. Through them:

C: The experiences of God's people have been preserved;

P: the laws of God have been declared;

C: the salvation of God has been experienced;

P: The will of God has been spoken by the prophets;

C: The purposes of God have been disclosed;

P: the person of God has been revealed in Jesus the Christ;

C: The love of God has been demonstrated in the life, death, and resurrection of God's Son;

P: The ways of God have been shown and lived by Jesus our Lord and Savior;

C: We praise the Lord, the God of heaven, for the gift of the Scriptures and the knowledge and wisdom contained therein.

- P: (hold Bibles up) This is the book that is above every other book we own or read.
- C: May we hold God's Word high and keep it as the rule and norm of our faith.**
- P: (hold Bible near Heart) May the Words, thoughts, inspiration, and wisdom in our Bibles be the life blood of our lives.
- C: May we hold God's Word dear to our lives and ever close to our hearts.**
- P: (hold Bibles open position) May God's Word be a lamp unto our feet and a light to our path.
- C: God help us always keep your Word open, and may our lives be open to allow You to lead us, instruct us and teach us in Your Ways.**
- P: (Make the Sign of the Cross) Jesus last words to His disciples long ago empowered them to go and make disciples, baptizing those new to the faith, and teaching one and all to obey everything He had commanded them. . . . in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: We dedicate our hearts and souls to learning the Word, loving the Word and living God's Word now and always.**
- P: Let us pray We thank you Lord God, for the precious gift of the Scriptures through which we may know of your gracious presence in our lives. Bless O Lord each of these Bibles that we have brought with us this day. May we dedicate our lives to getting into your Word on a daily basis, but more importantly allowing your Word to get into us. As we read, study, and meditate on your Word may we receive the fullness of your blessing. May its eternal message serve as a lamp unto our feet as we travel through darkened places. May its inspiration lift us when we feel discouraged and down-trodden. Through your Word may our faith be deepened and our witness made stronger. May it renew our lives, so that all we are reflects the light and the life of our Lord Jesus Christ in whose name we pray. Amen.
