



It was a year ago today, September 1st that my father in law Nick Lovdjeff took his last breath here on earth. He had completed everything he wanted to do in this life and was ready to join his wife and to be received by Jesus in heaven. Because we were in the covid lock down last September, we were unable to celebrate his life in this world and hold onto the promise of Jesus a place that has been prepared just for him. My wife Terri texted the family on Wednesday . . . “remembering one year later. Miss him a lot.”

As a way of continuing to remember and bring some closure, we scheduled this Labor Day as a time when all of the family would gather to share the military honors and commit his ashes

to the columbarium niche he will be placed in. So, this week I have been preparing to lead a committal funeral service there at the Abraham Lincoln National Cemetery near Joliet Illinois on Friday. Then on Saturday we will share in a celebration of resurrection life at his home church in Mount Prospect.

By vocation Nick was a teacher. And he did much of his teaching in places other than the classroom and with more than the students who were instructed in those classes he led. His greatest teachings were with friends and family. With all of us he taught life lessons perhaps his greatest teaching moments were in the last days of life. He knew the end was near. Nick was blessed to be surrounded by both his children and grandchildren. He could join the apostle Paul who proclaimed “I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, and I have remained faithful. And now the prize awaits me—the crown of righteousness.” In his living and in his dying Nick was an inspiration, and embodied light of Christ til the very end. Without a doubt, he faced his trials and suffering with a positive spirit and faith. What has been so touching is hearing from so many people this last year of how Nick touched other’s lives profound and lasting ways. Nick has left a legacy of love, courage, and hope. As I think back through the years, there have been so many saints of light in my ministry at Tabor, Bethlehem, St Philip, Bethel and here at St James who have done exactly the same thing. Other years other names but the same legacy has been passed on.

The verse at the top of the page comes at the end of John’s story of the feeding of the 5,000. In this story the one who has left a legacy that forever has been remembered is the little boy who put what he had in the hands of Jesus. When that little boy placed his lunch into Jesus’ hands the greatest miracle wasn’t that hungry people were fed; the greatest miracle was that people began to see Jesus as the promised Messiah. Listen

to what the story says, "After the people saw the miraculous sign that Jesus did, they began to say, "Surely this is the Prophet who is to come into the world."

The greatest legacy any one of us could leave behind is a life that points to Jesus Christ. The greatest legacy any one of us could leave behind is, by the grace and power of God, to help open the door for someone to a living relationship with Jesus Christ. Isn't that what the lives of the saints of all times have done for family and friends?

I know Jesus as my Lord because of people like Mrs. Oetter, and Tony Calebrusco, and Mrs. Kennedy, who left their legacy as my Sunday School teachers. I know Jesus as my Lord because my Mom and Dad worshiped weekly, taught me the Lord's Prayer, and modeled faithful living as their living legacy to me. I know Jesus as my Lord because Pastors Tom Johnson, Larry Bietti, and LaVerne Linnerson mentored me during some real formative years. I give thanks to rock solid friends Roy, Gary and KC who have walked with me in the journey of ministry. Not a single one of those individuals is rich and famous. Not a single one is extraordinary. None of them have won Olympic gold. But each one chose to place who they are and what they had into the hands of God, and by God's grace each pointed me to Jesus.

Every time we baptize someone we address this issue of their legacy. We hand them a candle and proclaim Jesus' words to them as their mission statement for life, "Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." That's the legacy we leave, and it's a legacy each of us can leave when we place all that we are and all that we have into the hands of the One who can multiply it, feed a hungry world, and point people to eternity. That is the legacy worth sharing now and forever.


Church Council Update

- ✚ **Pastor Doug** expressed his personal appreciation for the reception held in his honor for his 45th year in ministry. He also reported that VBS was a wonderful experience and that he spent the first week of August at the NALC Lectures and Convocation in Corpus Christi Texas. He also said that he is planning the rest of the year with Staff, working with the Christian Education Committee on Rally Day – September 12th and making plans for the next confirmation class that will start also on Rally Day.
- ✚ The **Council approved the Pastoral Act for Anna Marie Turner's confirmation** slated for Rally Day.
- ✚ Dawn Hahm reported that Tracy Guffey the **Call Committee Chairperson** was posting our **Pastor vacancy on the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC) site** in addition to the NALC listing. If an LCMC pastor is interested, they will contact us and would need to be certified by the NALC (if not yet certified).
- ✚ Linda Hess reported that the **Care & Prayer Ministry** Committee continues their work of checking in with members and bringing them communion. They also reviewed expenses for the last 12 months and agreed to a proposed budget for 2022.
- ✚ Alison LaFlower reported that the **Christian Education Committee** celebrated holding VBS and continues to be **very busy** planning for starting Children's Sunday School classes (K-2nd and 3rd-5th), Anna Marie's confirmation celebration, the new confirmation class (5th on up) and the new adult class "Waiting". They also completed their 2022 budget proposal.
- ✚ Dawn Hahm reported that the **Church Property** has been extremely busy with many items. The parsonage was vacated and repairs, painting and clean up has started. Other items at the church are also being addressed in order of importance. The Committee put forth a motion to the Council to authorize the Council President to sign the Property Management agreement to rent the parsonage. The motion was approved.
- ✚ Cindy Gregory presented and reviewed the current **financial status** of the congregation. Giving was down in July as compared to prior months. The **Finance Committee** is continuing the budget planning process for 2022.

- ✚ Betty Perotti reported that the **Mission, Benevolence and Outreach (MBO) Committee** approved the framework for the 2022 MBO budget and added some new domestic missions to the list.
- ✚ John Browder stated that the **Stewardship Committee** has begun meeting and will develop a plan after Pastor Doug and John attend the Stewardship workshop at the NALC Convocation. He also indicated that they are thinking of linking time and talent to Lent 2022.
- ✚ Joe Soberalski reported that the **Technology Committee** recommended upgrading Servant Keeper (our data base software) so that the update process for member information will be online. The team also reviewed options for added security and network solutions and prepared the Technology 2022 budget proposal. A decision was made to have the vendor who installed the projector in the sanctuary perform any work needed on the projector since they have the equipment to reach it. Also - no additional volunteers have stepped forward for the Video and Sound Technicians roles during worship and they are still needed.
- ✚ Marieta Fargo-Boone reported that the **Worship & Music Committee** has had a great response to the request for funding the Pew Bibles and the **Bibles have been ordered!** She also said that the Committee prepared their 2022 budget request and planned and discussed Rally Day worship, advent plans and other details.
- ✚ The **Council reviewed** the notes from the **July Coffee with Council**, the **membership roster update** and **status of the retreat ideas** that were assigned to the Council.
- ✚ The Council discussed possible **changes to the St. James Constitution** which is one of the Council Retreat ideas and formed a team to discuss them in more detail and bring back to the Council suggested alternative language for consideration. The team agreed to meet the following week to start the process.
- ✚ The Council discussed **candidates for the vacant Council Member term** (2 years and 5 months remaining) and the recent additional Council Member vacancy left by Terry Clark who resigned from Council in July (five months remaining). Pastor Doug took the action items to ask the candidates discussed if they would accept a nomination.





GivePlus App Changes - Important Information!

We have recently received notification from VANCO about upcoming changes to GivePlus mobile app. VANCO is the organization we use to process electronic contributions such as credit/debit card and electronic funds transfer transactions. VANCO's current mobile app GivePlus will be dropped on **September 30, 2021** and replaced by a new app called "VANCO Mobile".

As of **September 30, 2021**:

- All recurring giving options that have already been established using GivePlus will continue with no action required.
- All new one-time gifts and new or changes to recurring gifts must be processed using the new "VANCO Mobile" app.

The following actions are required by congregation members using GivePlus before Sep 30, 2021:


- Download the "VANCO Mobile" app by finding it on Google Play or the Apple App Store.
- Find "St James Lutheran Church, Greenfield, IN"
- Click "Give"
- Select the Fund you want, enter \$ amount, frequency, start date, payment method, and whether you want to cover processing fees.
- Review and click "Submit"

The new application seems simple. VANCO is working to transfer data from GivePlus to "VANCO Mobile" and Cindy is making sure our church is set up on the new app including the various fund options. She will give more instructions as necessary but wanted to give our congregation members using GivePlus advance notice of its conversion to "VANCO Mobile".






2. Select Your Fund and Amount

Select your fund and donation frequency, then select your payment method.







September is St James turn to take responsibility for filling the Community Blessing Box.

This blessing box is located at the Greenfield Police Dept. and is sponsored by local churches, with a different church contributing to it each month. It is meant as an opportunity to get shelf stable food (and some basic hygiene products) as families find themselves in need. It is NOT meant to serve as the food pantry. Families usually use it on an emergency basis.....such as it is a couple of days before food stamps are issued and the cupboards are bare, or they can't afford all the food they need and they come to the blessing box as a stop gap.



This is the third year that St. James has been involved. We will have a collection point for your donations near the doors to the Gathering Room.

Phil and Terry Miller will lead up the effort with the help of Diana Clements-Scott. If there are other members who wish to take a week to help monitor and fill the box, they should see Terry or Phil. We generally find if it is checked every 2 days or so, that works well.

Some of the more popular items that are frequently used first, include: cocktail franks, canned meats, crackers filled with cheese or peanut butter, cereal bars, & Ramen noodles. Other things that go well are apple sauce and canned fruits, peanut butter, name brand jelly, mac & cheese boxes, single toilet paper rolls, single paper towel rolls, name brand boxed sugary cereals (not corn flakes) ---either boxes or single servings, & tomato sauce.

Things that rarely get taken---bags of dried beans and rice, baby food and diapers, canned vegetables.

Thank you. Your efforts are appreciated.

MBO Committee Update

The focus of the MBO Committee in August was on Outreach. We will be supplying the blessing box at the Greenfield police station during the month of September. We also have had active discussion on an outreach with Veterans that will involve St James and its kitchen. Details are still being worked out, but we hope to start by the beginning of the year. There are Veterans who are having trouble adjusting and when we look around, we do not see other Churches reaching out to these specific people. It is a need that St. James can meet and allow broken people to become aware of their victory in Christ. Phil Miller has been working with his political and community connections to start organizing people who can facilitate and help contact people who may be in need. From St. James side I think we want to approach it with the principals described in the book Joining Jesus on His Mission by Greg Finke. Pastor Doug has introduced this to the congregation, and it takes a lot of pressure off many people who do not know how to evangelize. Jesus has already been working with and in these people, we just need to meet Jesus in the effort and wait. If you haven't read the book there are many copies floating around and Pastor Doug might have access to a few more. If anyone has an interest in Veterans and the issues that many are struggling with after coming back, please contact a Member of the MBO committee.






Baptism, First Communion and New Member Classes
