



## Celebrating Our History and Our Future

This year we will be celebrating Reformation Day on Reformation Day . . . October 31<sup>st</sup>. Now most people in the United States will observing this day as Halloween and getting ready for Trick or Treating and Halloween parties. But Lutherans in particular will also observe this holy day with thanks and joy for what happened 504 years ago when a young monk named Martin Luther nailed 95 thesis on the Wittenberg castle door, citing the things he found wrong in the church of his day. That event sparked the beginning of the Reformation.



The core values that we hold as part of the NALC can be traced back to Luther and further back even to the times of the Apostle's. Indeed, we are a part of the "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic" church" established by Jesus Christ himself. We are Christ centered, always focused on the life death and resurrection of Jesus. We are traditionally grounded which means God's Word is the heart and center of all that we teach and all that we believe. And

we adhere to the truths summarized in the early Christian Creeds. We are mission driven using Jesus' Great Commission (Matthew 28) and Jesus' Great Commandment (Luke 10:25-28) "Love the Lord your God and your neighbor as yourself" as the motivation and mission of our church. And we are congregationally focused living together as the body of Christ.

As Lutherans we take our name from Martin Luther who lived from 1483 to 1546. In those 95 these, Luther protested the errors he saw in the church. Therefore, the movement first was known as Protestants, and to further define ourselves, we became known as Lutherans.

Who was Martin Luther? The Lutheran historian Martin Marty describes him as a "fallible, energetic, robust, occasionally crude, never dull German monk who had tried to please God by living the disciplines of a monastery. But he experienced the wrath and not the love of God for those efforts. A reading of the Bible, particularly the letters of Paul, led him to an experience of God's unmerited goodness. He became a preacher, reformer, Church leader, author of scores of books, family man, and proclaimer that God forgives people out of love, through Jesus Christ."

Luther never intended to break with the medieval Catholic Church, but he found himself excommunicated for defense of the gospel, because he was solidly grounded on God's Word and not the authority of the Pope. And he was reluctant and somewhat embarrassed when people began calling the evangelical churches that followed his lead . . . . Lutheran. Luther wanted to reform the church from top to bottom . . . . inside and out . . . striving to hold on to the great Catholic tradition, only changing that which was

"false, unscriptural, and unmeaningful." Thus, there are many who see us as Lutherans as "Catholic lite."

But what makes Lutherans distinctly "Lutheran?" the scriptural message from the Apostle Paul of "justification by grace through faith for Christ's sake," is foundational. For us as Lutherans it is all about grace . . . . God coming down. And maybe you have heard as I have that fundamentally grace is

And all that we are and all that we hope to be is a responsive living because of God's grace.

We are a Christ-centered people. In Christ we are made free from the curse of the Law. We do not see the basis of the Christian life as Law: that shows us our sin. The basis for the Christian life is the Gospel; first Christ liberates us, then as we are free to serve. Lutherans are a sacramental people. We believe that God shares His divine Being with us in human ways. In Baptism He adopts us as His own beloved children. In the Lord's Supper, we celebrate Christ's real presence and forgiveness just for us.

Scripture is central for us. That is why we place God's Word above of any human reason. Lutherans would reject the modern liberalism that places human reason above Scripture. As Martin Marty writes, "In classical Lutheran teaching, the Bible is authoritative not because one has from beginning to end some doctrine of its reliability, but rather because through its witness one has been led to knowledge and faith in Christ."

Scripture alone! Grace alone! Faith alone! That is our heritage of the Lutheran Reformation. That is reason to celebrate.

# CHURCH COUNCIL



## Church Council Update

- Council welcomed **Wanda Stephens-Wooten** as the newest **Council Member!** We thank her for agreeing to fulfill a vacancy on the Council. She will also be the **Council Liaison to the Finance Committee.**
- **Pastor Doug** reported that Rally Day was “wonderful” with the highlight being **Anna Marie Turner’s Confirmation** as well as the installation of the **fourteen teachers** for this year’s Christian Education programs. He also has started a new two-year **Confirmation class program of with 6 students.** He participated in the NALC’s “Interim Ministry Training” also.
- **Linda Hess** reported that the **Care & Prayer Ministry Committee** continues their work and are discussing some added ways to help people of the Congregation in need of a ride to worship, or a word of encouragement or other types of help. Details will be forthcoming.
- **Alison LaFlower** reported that the **Christian Education Committee** held Rally Day as described above in the summary of Pastor Doug’s report. The next focus will be a New Member’s class to be held before the end of the year.
- **Dawn Hahm** reported that the **Church Property Committee** continues work on the parsonage and the items on that list are almost complete! Work is also continuing on other items at the church in order of importance.
- **Cindy Gregory** presented and reviewed the current **financial status** of the congregation. Expenses were higher than usual in August due to property repairs that were needed for the church roof and the purchase of the copier. The **Finance Committee** is continuing the budget planning process for 2022.
- **Betty Perotti** reported that the **Mission, Benevolence and Outreach (MBO) Committee** decided to not support a mission they were vetting since they did not receive a response to the vetting questions. She also indicated that work has started on forming a Veteran’s outreach program and more details will be available soon.
- **John Browder** stated that the **Stewardship Committee** has set the dates of October 24<sup>th</sup>, 31<sup>st</sup> and November 7<sup>th</sup> for the stewardship drive.
- **Joe Soberalski** reported for the **Technology Committee** that a much-needed replacement laptop for the Treasurer (Cindy Gregory) will be ordered. The team is also reviewing options for fixing Wi-Fi problems throughout the church building, upgrading MS Office applications and installing a intercom with camera for the


administrative assistant to use when alone in the building. He also said that unfortunately no added volunteers have come forward for the Video and Sound Technicians roles during worship and they are still needed.

- **John Browder** reported that the **Constitution Team** has been meeting and putting together a revision of the **St. James Constitution**. The revision will be brought to the Council for consideration as soon as it is ready.
- **Dawn Hahm** brought a **proposed motion from the Finance Committee to add one day per week to the Covenant for Ministry that St. James has with Pastor Doug** since he now has more time available for St. James after retiring from Bethel. The **motion was approved** pending the Mutual Ministry Committee support for the motion (the Mutual Ministry Committee's meeting fell the day after the September Council meeting). The added day would begin October 1, 2021.
- **Betty Perotti** and **Marietta Fargo-Boone** reported that they are almost done with **re-organizing the church library!** They will be getting information out about the new and improved library soon.


## STEWARDSHIP LESSON FROM THOSE CRAZY GEESE



The next time you see geese flying south in "V" formation, you might be interested to know that as each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in a V formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own. Christians who share a common direction and sense of community can also get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the uplift of one another. Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone, and quickly gets back into formation. If we have as much sense as a goose, we stay in formation with those who are headed the same way we are going. When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates back in the V and another goose flies point. It pays to take turns doing hard jobs with people at church or with geese flying south. The geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. What do we say when we honk from behind? Finally, when a goose gets sick or is wounded and falls out, two geese fall out of formation and follow it down to help protect it. They stay with it until it is able to fly or die; and then they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their original group. The geese who helped each other shared. Sharing is both serving and giving. It's a part of "stewardship."

I walked by our library every time I went to the bathroom or down to the music room or to one of the Sunday School classrooms. I hardly noticed. But there has been a transformation that has taken place. Our books have been organized, sorted, put in sections and labeled. Some of the oldest books have found a new home. Special thanks go to Betty Perotti and Marieta Boone who have shared their time and energy in this labor of love. They said "we do have some really good books for people to take home and read. Just bring them back when you are done. Also, there is a space for you to donate books that you would like to share. Thanks to our willing volunteer servants.



## **HALLOWEEN: ITS ANCIENT ORIGINS**



There are several possibilities for the origin of giving treats as part of trick-or-treating. It was a belief among the Celts that on the night before the Druid celebration of the New Year (November 1) evil spirits, demons and witches roamed freely to great their season of winter darkness. These would threaten, scare, and play tricks on people. The only way to be safe was to bribe them with treats or to pass as one of them by dressing and acting like one of them. For a while, after Christianity arrived in Celtic lands, there was an attempt to transfer these customs to the eve of All Souls Day (November 2), i.e., the night on November 1st when masked children would go from door to door to pray for departed loved ones in return for a treat.

**FYI, new date on pulling the plug on Give Plus is Jan 31, 2022.**




## Baptism, First Communion and New Member Classes
