“So they called to the blind man, “Cheer up! On your feet! He’s calling you.”⁵⁰ Throwing his cloak aside, he jumped to his feet and came to Jesus.⁵¹ “**What do you want me to do for you?**” Jesus asked him. The blind man said, “Rabbi, I want to see.”⁵² “Go,” said Jesus, “**your faith has healed you.**” Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road.” *(Mark 10:49-52)*

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The story of blind Bartimaeus is a powerful account of Jesus’ compassion on human need. Bartimaeus knew who to ask for help and what kind of help to request. Yet as Jesus pointed out, it was his faith that helped him have true sight. Just as for Bartimaeus, what is most important for us is how we answer the question Jesus puts to us.

Adding to the power of the story is its placement in Mark’s gospel after several accounts of people who were spiritually blind just before the entry to Jerusalem. When Bartimaeus followed Jesus, He was following him in compassionate giving to others. We are invited to embark on that same journey.
