So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.

But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.⁹(Luke 2:15-19 NIV)



By the time you are reading this pastor's page, we will be well into Advent and counting the days til Christmas Day. These days of Advent pass by all but too quickly. This is the year that all of our children and grandchildren will be together at our house. If I have my math right, that will 22 in total. It is chaotic. It is loud. It is a lot of groceries bought and consumed. But it is fun of the first order. We are blessed with a wonderful family that actually enjoys being together. It will be a time of great celebration.

Hopefully I can get all or at least most to the Christmas Eve service here at St James. That is the time to reflect on the wonder and the blessings that the birth of our Lord and Savior bring.

I love the Christmas story as Luke presents it. I never tire of reading it or hearing the story again and again. It seems I always see or hear something new. As I was preparing this devotion, I read this part of the story a half dozen times. The thing that struck me was the action. Angels come . . . then they're gone . . . shepherds say: let's go . . . let's see . . . so they hurried off . . . they found what they were looking for . . . they spread the news. Come and see. Now go and tell. That's the story line of Luke's Christmas story.

I was reminded of a Christmas tradition that my sister in law, Bonnie, shared with her daughters when they were little. Of course, the girls were always up early, ready to open presents. But before any present could be opened, here was the game . . . the girls had to find baby Jesus and put him in the manger in the nativity set that sat on the console TV. No present could be opened before baby Jesus was found. Bonnie said she started the hide and seek Jesus, in order to give her time to brew a pot of coffee, so she could get awake. Smart lady. The girls would race through the house, shrieking in delight, laughing with joy. They would search and search until that moment when the baby Jesus was discovered. And when they found him, you would have thought they would have found pure gold. They'd run into the kitchen yelling we found him. Here's Jesus! They had to tell mom/dad, grandpa/grandma and anyone and everyone who was in the house. Then, they would proudly and gently place Jesus in the manger . . . and then . . . and then tear into their presents.

I think Bonnie taught her girls a Christmas lesson far greater than she could have ever imagined. Wouldn't it be great if every parent had a rule, "no presents, until you find Jesus?" Wouldn't it be great if we all followed the shepherds lead and do anything and everything we could to find the manger so that we could see Jesus? Can you imagine the impact the Christmas story would have if we all would shout at the top of our lungs . . . "We've seen Jesus." We have seen Jesus . . . his face filled with love. We've seen Jesus . . . his countenance filled with purity and holiness. We have seen Jesus . . . God's true Son . . . Lord and Savior, Prince of Peace, our Emmanuel. Take time these days of Advent, either alone . . . or with your family to look into the manger, and then tell at least one other of what today truly means. You'll be blessed. So will they. A blessed Christmas to you and your family.

CHURCH COUNCIL

Church Council Update

- ✦ **Pastor Doug** reported that plans for the Advent services both mid-week and Sundays as well as Christmas Eve were organized. He also said that he has delivered performance evaluations to all the staff members. He shared some of the details of the NALC Dean's Meeting he attended which highlighted that recruitment for additional Pastors is a high priority and there was much discussion about the new Ordination Under Special Circumstances. He also reported that renewal of Congregations is a great need since many churches are stagnant, plateaued, or declining. He also shared that the NALC is bringing in one Pastor every week and a half and one new congregation every 2-3 weeks. The Dean's also got an update on the new NALC central office in Dallas and the upcoming campaign to raise funds to further the mission of the NALC.

- ✦ **Dawn Hahm** reported for the **Church Property Committee**. She indicated that the parsonage has been rented and that we have verbally been informed that Bethesda will be moving out at the end of 2021. Work is also continuing on other items at the church in order of importance.

- ✦ **Cindy Gregory** distributed the current **financial reports** of the congregation. Ronald Kissell Chair of the Finance Committee presented the 2022 Proposed Budget to the Council. The Council reviewed it and approved it as presented. It was agreed that the Annual Congregational Budget meeting would be held on December 5th immediately after worship. Notification will be made to all members and a copy of the proposed budget will be distributed for member review the week prior to the meeting via email.

- ✦ **Betty Perotti** reported that the **Terry Clark** and **Phil Miller** of the **Mission, Benevolence and Outreach (MBO) Committee** are continuing planning for a new outreach program and the Committee will give a temple talk on November 21st about all this committee is doing. **Linda Hess** reported that she researched if the Greenfield Police department has gas cards available for those in need (we would refer people who stop at the church and ask for gas money) and said that they do not and the hospital may have something. They also advised that we ask for identification when asked and track who we give to. **Alison LaFlower** reported that the recent outreach **Blood Drive** was again a good success with 21 donations! **Cindy** also reported that the outreach activity **GriefShare** sessions as well as the one-day event "Surviving the Holidays" went well, and the next session is planned for an Easter start.

- ✦ **Joe Soberalski** reported that the **Technology Committee** continues to work on several items.

- ✦ **Marieta Fargo-Boone** reported that the Worship Committee has been very busy preparing for the All-Saints Day, Advent mid-week meals and services and Sunday services as well as Christmas Eve. Christmas Eve worship will be held at 4:30 pm.


- ✦ **Dawn** and the **Constitution Team** reviewed the proposed changes to the St. James Constitution with the Council. Discussion on the changes as well as the schedule for approval from Council and taking it to the Congregation took place. There were a few changes suggested by Council and it was decided that Council will review the final version

in the December meeting and if approved the final proposed changes will be taken to the Congregation at the Annual Congregational Meeting in January.

- ✦ **Dawn** reported that the **online membership update** was underway and **50% of the members have updated their contact information!** She said that Wendy will remind those who have not updated to do so as soon as possible and offer an alternative to anyone not able to do it online. Dawn also reported that St. James **has been approved to apply for Walmart Community Grants** and that she would get out to the Council members and all Committee Chairs the specifics on how to apply for the grants.
- ✦ The **Council** reviewed the notes from the October 24th **Coffee with Council**.
- ✦ The **Council** discussed the **timing and agenda for the Annual Congregational meeting** and the timeline for creating the **Annual Report**. The meeting will be held on January 23rd after the worship service. An email notification will be sent later in December with an agenda and any other information required for review prior to the meeting.
- ✦ The **Council** agreed that the annual membership roster review was complete since we have been reviewing and updating it throughout the year in Council meetings.
- ✦ **Dawn** also shared that she was asked about having a **Christmas Celebration** for all members. The celebration would be an intergenerational time for fellowship including building gingerbread houses, a white elephant exchange etc. The Council supported this effort. **Tracy Guffey, Wanda Stephens-Wooten and Alison** said they would help with getting it organized.
- ✦ **Dawn** announced that a **St. James brochure** was completed and used in the New Member Packet. It is also available by the guest book and the brochure stand. Members should feel to take copies and share them with others. She also explained that the New Member Packet is full of **“everything St. James”!**
- ✦ The **Council** discussed the **December Council meeting date** and decided to move it up one week since it originally fell on December 21st and very close to Christmas holidays. **The meeting will be held December 15th at 6 pm** and used primarily to review and potentially approve the proposed St. James Constitutional changes in time for them to be reviewed for consideration by the Congregation in January.






Baptism and First Communion Classes
