Pastor Doug's Musings February 2022

Jesus said: "I tell you the truth, anyone who has faith in me will do what I have been doing. He will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." (John 14:12)

"We know that we live in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit." (1 John 4:13)

The Apostle John wrote 5 books of the New Testament. the Gospel that bears his name, along with 3 epistles that bear his name, as well as the last book of the Bible –Revelation. Even though he uses different styles in his various writings, there are several themes that are reiterated through all of them. Light, life, and love are consistently strong themes that echo in everything he writes. But it struck me the other day that there is another theme that reverberates in his writings, and that is seeing Jesus and by seeing him in our world we believe.

There is an old camp song entitled, "Have You Seen Jesus My Lord?" For those of you who know it, you remember the second line in the chorus "He's here in plain view." And Jesus does give us signs of his presence everyday, just for the looking. But what I always worry about is the question, do others see signs of Jesus presence in me? Can they see, or sense, or feel, or hear, or notice the Jesus who lives in my heart or life or not?



I love stories. Here is one that exemplifies what I am trying to share. A few years ago a group of salesmen went to a regional sales convention in Chicago. They had assured their wives that they would be home in plenty of time for Friday night's dinner. In their rush, with ticket and briefcases, one of these salesmen kicked over a table, which held a display of apples. Apples flew everywhere. Without stopping or looking back, they all managed to reach the plane in time for their nearly missed boarding.

All but one! He paused, took a deep breath, got in touch with his feelings, and experienced a twinge of compassion for the girl whose apple stand had been overturned.

He told his co-workers to go on without him, waved good-bye, and told one of them to call his wife when they arrived at their home destination to explain his taking a later flight. Then he returned to the terminal where the apples were all over the terminal floor. He was glad he did.

The 16 year old girl was totally blind! She was crying softly, tears running down her cheeks in frustration, and at the same time helplessly groping for her spilled produce as the crowd swirled about her, no one stopping and no one to care for her plight.

The salesman knelt on the floor with her, gathered up the apples, put them back on the table and helped organize her display. As he did this, he noticed that many of the apples had become battered and bruised; these he set aside in another basket.

When he had finished, he pulled out his wallet and said to the girl, "Here, please take this \$40 for the damage we did. Are you okay? She nodded through the tears. He continued on with, "I hope we didn't spoil your day too badly."

As the salesman started to walk away, the bewildered blind girl called out to him, "Mister . . ." He paused and turned to look back into those blind eyes. She continued, "Are you Jesus?"

He stopped in mid-stride, and let that question sink in. Then slowly he made his way to catch the later flight with those words burning and bouncing about in his soul: "Are you Jesus?"

Do people ever mistake you for Jesus? Do others see the heart of Jesus through your heart? Do those around you feel the spirit of Christ in your words, your actions, your attitudes, your priorities? It seems to me that one of the goals of our lives is growing in Jesus a little more every day. And at the same time don't we want Jesus to grow in us so that people cannot tell the difference as we live and interact with a world that is blind to His love, life, and grace.

If we claim to know him, we should live, walk, and act as He would. Knowing Him is more than simply quoting Scripture and going to church. It's actually living the Word as life unfolds day to day.

The Apostle John knew that long ago. . . . "we live in Jesus and he in us . . ." And because we have faith in Him, not only will we do the things He did, but the promise is that we will do even greater things in His name. Watch for Jesus. He is always here. Sometimes he'll even be seen through us. Let's hope so.







Happenings from the Annual Congregational Meeting January 23, 2022

- ✚ We had a good turnout – exceeded our quorum requirement by a lot!
- ✚ We approved the minutes from the last Annual meeting and the last Budget Meeting.
- ✚ We reviewed highlights of the Annual Report.
- ✚ We discussed and approved the proposed changes to the St. James Constitution.
- ✚ We asked the Council to consider three additional changes to the St. James Constitution:
 - ✚ Require an external audit whenever the individual in the Treasurer position changes.
 - ✚ Not require an annual meeting in June 2022 (since one of the changes changed the annual meeting timeframe to June from the first two months of the year and we met in January 2022).
 - ✚ Provide for changes to the proposed Constitutional amendments to be allowed to be made at the time of discussion instead of having to meet the notification requirements as stated in the Constitution.
- ✚ We elected Neal Guffey and Jessie Stearns and re-elected Alison LaFlower each to a 3-year term on our church council.
- ✚ We re-elected Maggie Bode to the Audit committee.
- ✚ We elected Cindy Gregory, Dawn Hahm, Debbie Mowery, Jeanette Berkshire, Ronald Kissell and Terry Clark and to our Nominating Committee.
- ✚ We also shared our heartfelt appreciation to Dawn Hahm, who has led us as council president for the last 2 years.
- ✚ We voted to approve the Ratification Vote of the resolution to amend Article 11 - Regional Subdivisions 11.01, 11.02, 11.03 of the NALC Constitution.



Update on the Mekane Yesus Seminary



Our NALC has had a great deal of focus on the Mekane Yesus Seminary these last months. Much has happened and continues to happen. We as the NALC are committed to the work of the seminary and we want to be sure to keep everyone in the NALC up to speed.

Just a bit of background, the Mekane Yesus Seminary is located in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. It is the largest seminary of what is the largest Lutheran body in the world. We as the NALC have a significant and blessed relationship with both the Mekane Yesus Church and the seminary.

You may have heard of efforts to raise funds for a revenue generating facility on campus. A new six-floor building is almost completed on the campus. A couple floors of the building will be rented to generate an income of at least \$225,000/year. The remaining floors will be available for the seminary and Lutheran Bible Translators. By the grace of God, we now have good reason to believe that sufficient funds will be in place to complete that project by this coming spring. A number of people from the NALC have been hard at work on this for a number of years.

We now have tremendous reason to celebrate what God has been doing. We can celebrate the opportunity we within the NALC have had to be a part of God accomplishing the miraculous. Praise be to God!


Sadly, there is still great need. The seminary was devastated by an unprecedented flash flood in August. Although the large new revenue-generating building was untouched, damage on campus is in the millions of dollars. 8 people lost their lives. Much of the seminary will remain incapacitated until funds are raised to rebuild.

We are happy to report we have sent money from our MBO fund there!



WHAT IS PTSD?

Posttraumatic stress disorder, or PTSD, is a mental health concern that some people develop after they see or experience a traumatic event.



7 to 8%

of the U.S. population will have PTSD at some point in their lives.



What it's like to have PTSD may be different for everyone. There are four types of PTSD symptoms.



Reliving or re-experiencing the event

- Nightmares
- Flashbacks
- Triggers



Hyperarousal or being on guard

- Being jittery or overly alert
- Difficulty sleeping or concentrating
- Feeling angry or irritable



Avoidance

- Avoiding crowds
- Avoiding certain smells, sights, or sounds
- Avoiding talking or thinking about the event



Negative changes in beliefs and feelings

- Losing interest in things you used to enjoy
- Feeling guilty or ashamed
- Unable to trust others

INJURIES OF THE HEART, SOUL, AND MIND

In 2020, the suicide rate in the military hit a record high as 580 service members in all four branches took their lives. This disturbing fact is just one of many that underscores the toll a decade of wars has had on the hearts, souls and minds of our all-volunteer force.

Coming home, for many veterans and their families the battles have just begun. Today, the need for community caregivers has never been greater.

While terms such as PTSD, substance abuse, and adjustment disorder may be intimidating, every person can help with the process that will lead to the “healing their hearts” beginning with simply learning how to listen.

This workshop is intended for counselors, social workers, clergy, and anyone who wants to help our veterans and their families make a healthy transition back home.

At the end of this seminar, attendees will:

1. have a greater understanding of the root causes of traumatic military stress injuries;
2. understand how military culture affects service members thought processes, decision making and ability to return to civilian life;
3. understand the unique challenges of military service as it relates to barriers between caregivers, our warriors and their families, and
4. consider ways that they can provide more effective ministry outreach and care to veterans, contractors & their family members in their community.

Today, chances have never been greater that you will be asked to help someone who has been impacted by their military service.


