## **Pastors Musings**



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is with great joy that I write to you to share the exciting news of the growth of our church. Over the past ten months, we have seen increased attendance at our services and participation in various ministries. We have also welcomed new families into our community, and I am so grateful for how God works in and through HIS CHURCH at St.James!

As we reflect on this growth, we are reminded of the words of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew, where he says, "I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18 ESV). These words remind us that St. James's growth is not something we can take credit for ourselves; instead, it results from God's work in our midst.

At the same time, we also recognize that much work still needs to be done. We are called to continue to share the good news of the Gospel with those around us and to serve as witnesses to the love and grace of Jesus Christ. We are also called to care for one another, support one another in our struggles, and celebrate with one another in our joys.

Looking to the future, I believe God has great plans for St.James. We are called to continue to grow in our faith, deepen our relationships with one another, and reach out to those around us who are in need. I believe God is calling us to be a community deeply rooted in the Word of God and the Lutheran Confessions and committed to living out our faith in every aspect of our lives.

As we consider this vision for the future, we are reminded of the words of the Apostle Paul in his letter to the Ephesians, where he writes, "Now to him who can do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen" (Ephesians 3:20-21 ESV). These words remind us that God can do far more than we could ever imagine or ask for and that as we trust in him and follow his leading, he will continue to work in and through HIS CHURCH at St. James for HIS glory.

As we look to the future, we also turn to the writings of Martin Luther and the Lutheran Confessions for guidance and wisdom. One of the critical teachings of the Lutheran Church is the doctrine of justification by faith, which emphasizes that we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ alone and not by any works that we can do. This doctrine reminds us that our salvation is a gift from God and that it is not something that we can earn or achieve on our own.

At the same time, the Lutheran Confessions also emphasize the importance of good works and living out our faith daily. In the Augsburg Confession, for example, we read that "it is also taught among us that such faith should produce good fruits and good works and that we must do all such good works as God has commanded, but we should not rely on these works to merit justification before God" (Article VI). This teaching reminds us that our faith is not just something we believe in our hearts but should be reflected in how we live and interact with others.

As we consider these teachings, we are reminded that HIS church is called to be a community of faith rooted in God's grace and committed to living out our faith in every aspect of our lives. We are called to be a community marked by love, compassion, righteousness and a deep commitment to serving others. As Jesus himself said, "By this, all people will know that you are my disciples if you have a love for one another" (John 13:35 ESV).

I believe that as we continue to grow in our faith and commitment to living out the Gospel, God will continue to bless St.James and use us to make a difference in our community and the world. I am excited about the possibilities and am grateful for how God is already at work in our midst.

At the same time, we also recognize that there will be challenges along the way. We will face difficulties and obstacles, and sometimes we are tempted to lose heart or sight of our vision. But in those moments, we can take comfort in the words of the Apostle Paul, who reminds us that "we are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed" (2 Corinthians 4:8-9 ESV).

As we continue to move forward as a church community, let us hold fast to the hope we have in Jesus Christ and be steadfast in our commitment to living out our faith in every aspect of our lives. Let us continue to grow in our love for one another, to serve one another in humility, and to be a light to the world around us.

May God continue to bless St.James, and may we continue to grow in our love for him and one another.

These events will be held at Grace Lutheran Church in Westerville, which is just outside Columbus, Ohio. You are welcome to attend Friday only, Saturday only or both days. # **May is National Foster Care Awareness Month**











Lutherwald • Lutheran Hills • Lake Luther


